What Is Professional Learning?

Professional learning – also known as professional development, staff development or continuing education – is the investment in additional, ongoing education and training for teachers to increase their effectiveness and improve learning for their students.

Why Do Educators Need Additional Training?

It takes years for new educators to develop the skills needed to become experts in their roles. And veteran educators need to stay current with new practices. What Are the Benefits of Professional Learning?

The more knowledgeable a teacher is, the more effective their teaching becomes. What Makes Professional Learning Effective?

Professional learning should build educators' instructional knowledge, provide guidance on the use of evidence-based curricula, and include job-embedded coaching to ensure what educators learn is successfully put into practice. What Does Professional Learning Look Like?

Traditionally, professional learning is a formal learning model that includes workshops, seminars, conferences, and college courses.
