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





Language


- It is completely possible to learn how to read, write and speak in two languages at the same time.

- It has to be explicitly taught






House of Literacy







Scarborough's Reading Rope





What You'll Learn


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Key Teaching Practices

- Data-based and diagnostic






Implication for Instructional Organization

- Based on diagnostic screening/placement






The language teacher in you will...

- Understand that every lesson is based on language

- Encourage parents to read/speak with students in heritage language at home


